# Final ESS Item usage report publication period 2003-2023

#### Based on 4982 substantive publications

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The item usage report is based on **4982** *substantive publications* (journal articles, working and conference papers, book chapters) published between **2003** and **2023** where relevant individual items were present and could be identified. Publications were identified using *Google Scholar* indexing tool. Following the searching exercises, publications were downloaded via University of Ljubljana server which provides access to main academic data bases.

The usage of items from the **A**, **B** and **C** core sections of the ESS questionnaire and rotating modules was identified via *Data and methods* sections of the downloaded publications, as well as tables, appendices and the text itself. **F section** items are generally not counted due to extensive usage of standard demographic variables, or hidden usage which could result in imprecise estimates. The exception is 13 well used F items whose counts are listed at the end of the Core section of the table. The report includes only those ESS rounds which are 'active' from the perspective of publishing (**Rounds 1-10**).

Even though the number of publications on which item usage count is based is quite extensive, it does not represent the entire population of ESS items used in academic publications, the most notable omission being the non-English publications. Its primary aim is therefore to chart relative patterns of item usage, i.e. identify parts of the ESS questionnaires with strong and weak usage.

Organization of the report:

• Part 1 (pages 2-8) presents usage numbers for the A, B, C and F Core items, current and past.

• Part 2 (pages 9-56) presents usage numbers for Rotating module items from Rounds 1 to 10. For repeat modules, only usage numbers for new items are presented at the end of the original module.

• Some items are shared by two or more modules and appear in the table more than once. In such cases their usage count is put in brackets for all but the first repetition.

• The Notes column provides additional relevant details for items.
